2007 PROPERTY TAX RATES

The following quote is from the summary of the actual effective and rollback tax rate calculations provided by the Tarrant County Tax Assessor-Collector. The numbers in braces [] were provided from the report for the reader's convenience.

"This notice concerns 2007 property tax rates for CITY OF BEDFORD. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing

unit used to determine property taxes last year. [0.446882/\$100] This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. [0.438692/\$100] This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. [0.462137/\$100] In each case, these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value."

SUNSET PROVISION ORDINANCE

City staff discovered this week that in 2002 the City Council approved an ordinance creating a sunset review every two years for the Beautification Commission, Community Affairs Commission, Library Board and the Parks and Recreation Board. This renewal did not take place at the end of 2006, as required by the ordinance. Therefore, the City Council must take action to reauthorize these Boards and appoint members. Reauthorization has been placed on the City Council Agenda for Tues. Aug. 14 so that this can be rectified immediately.

Ordinance 04-2776 amended Boards and Commissions by extending the sunset provision an additional two years. It was originally presented and passed Dec. 14, 2004, by a 7-0-0 vote at a regular meeting

of the City Council while R.D. "Rick" Hurt was mayor. The ordinance provides a date on which each of those four Commissions and Boards will cease to exist unless specifically continued by the City Council.

HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS MEET WITH COMMUNITY AFFAIRS

Last night, the Volunteer Community
Affairs Commission hosted a joint meeting
with representatives of the Bedford Home
Owners Associations and Assisted Living
Centers at the Bedford Public Library. The
purpose of the meeting was, "to ensure all
residents are informed of what is going on
in the City and to know that their feedback
and suggestions are desired. We wanted to
foster a greater sense of community and
see if there are other suggestions for
making life better in Bedford."

It was evident that a lot of care had gone into the preparation for this meeting. It was well executed and very well attended.

After introductions, the City's new B-Service was discussed. This is a system available from the City's web site for use by the citizens in reporting their concerns to the City. The system is intended to, "streamline the handling of citizen concerns, requests, suggestions and complaints in the most effective and responsive way."

The Beautification Commission presented information on a "theme" for the City similar to the themes in our neighbor cities. They also described the Adopt-a-Street program and encouraged a voluntary biannual Bedford Clean Up Day.

Citizens were encouraged to keep their eyes open and report suspicious events to the police by Sergeant Randy Gardner. He said that the best number to use to contact the police when it is not an emergency is 817-952-2127. He said this number will take the caller directly to the police dispatcher. Sergeant Gardner and City Fire Marshall Kirt White encouraged the citizens to attend the Fire Academy for Citizens and the Citizens Police Academy.

It was agreed that more joint meetings will be held quarterly.
